

Are you interested in helping us walk with moms who are pregnant or parenting and need some help?

St. Brigid Catholic Church in Johns Creek, GA, has a very active ministry doing these *very* things. Many of these women were rescued from aborting their child and that is how we met them.

Here are current needs:

- Help facilitate communication with Spanish-speaking moms. (Spanish-speaking volunteers needed.)
- Mail or deliver updated clothing sizes for babies.
- Visit a new mom and take a casserole or send a meal via a meal delivery system.
- Visit a Spanish-speaking mom in Norcross weekly to help play with her 1-year-old who has spina bifida. (Spanish-speaking volunteers needed.)
- Collect items needed for a mom's home and help move moms into new apartments.
- Donate gas cards for moms who are finding it difficult to afford gas to get to work.
- Donate an older car and help a mom achieve more independence. (We work with a car donation program. You would get a tax-deductible donation receipt.)
- Pay rent for a mom while she is recovering from childbirth and has no benefits to pay her bills. (You can do this by donating to St. Brigid's Saint Vincent de Paul ministry and in the memo line write Crisis Pregnancy Fund.)
- Attend a baby shower or send a gift for a shower.
- Help on an as-needed basis to offer support. For example: join us to meet a mom in crisis over lunch to offer hope and love. Some happen in advance;some happen at the last minute. Join our list of people we could call to help us as your schedule permits.
- Donate gift cards.
- Provide treat bags for moms. At the baby showers we throw, every mom gets a personal gift bag with treats such as lotion, socks, candy, body spray, and other goodies for *her*.
